This moving programme – curated by Trinity Choir sopranos Frederica Davies and Rosamund Elias Turner – anticipates the observance of All Souls' Day on Sunday.

Earthquake in the Soul (premiere)

TCMS is thrilled to host the world premiere of Jeremy Thurlow's new mass Earthquake in the Soul, to be performed by Lady Clare Consort with instrumentalists under the baton of Isaac Chan. Jeremy Thurlow is an affiliated lecturer of the Faculty of Music, and his works have been performed by ensembles such as the BBC Philharmonic and the Endymion Ensemble. The mass explores the visions of renowned medieval nun and polymath Hildegard von Bingen while simultaneously evoking Brumel's Earthquake Mass, and the programme incorporates Renaissance and high Romantic elements to bring about an atmosphere of reflection.
