Beginning his final undergraduate year, Ben reads music at Queens' College, Cambridge, where he holds both the Aliki Vatikioti Senior Organ Scholar and an academic foundation scholarship in music. Alongside these awards, he holds the prestigious Harry Gabb Scholarship of the Royal College of Organists and was until recently the Magister Scholae of the Fisher House Schola Cantorum, Cambridge. He has recently passed his LTCL (in piano performance) with distinction and his ARCO. He was Organ Scholar at Worcester Cathedral during the year 2019-2020, where he was responsible for assisting with the training of the choristers and accompanying the cathedral choirs. He currently studies organ with Jeremiah Stevenson, singing with Sam Evans and James Oldfield, keyboard with Francis Knights, and Alexander Technique with Polly Waterfield.

Ben frequently performs around Cambridge having given solo recitals across Cambridge, and is active as a keyboardist and conductor. Recent performances include playing continuo in Handel's Xerxes and Dixit Dominus as well as conducting Tchaikowsky's Symphony 5 in e minor, Mozart's 'Great' Mass in C minor, and Vaughan-Williams' 'Fantasia on a theme by Thomas Tallis'. Beyond Cambridge, he has recently given recitals in St Edmundsbury Cathedral and Birmingham Cathedral as well as having conducted a service of evensong with his Farrant Choir in Westminster Abbey.
